

The Installation of an Archbishop is a joyful occasion of great significance in the life of a diocese. The rites are rich in symbolism, incorporating detailed ceremonial. Before such an event it is good to make time for prayer; as individuals, as communities, as a diocese, and to pray for ourselves, our Church and our work.

The public prayer of God's people has always been considered among the first duties of the Church. Over the centuries, the traditional elements of Christian prayer were carefully arranged, to sanctify the whole day in prayer in the Divine Office.

The Office of Vespers, the traditional Evening Prayer of the Church, offers to God our praise for the day that is ending, and in the words of the Canticle of Mary, 'glorifies the Lord' for his goodness to us.

This evening's Vespers is taken from the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary, invoking her prayers as Patron of the Diocese under the title of Our Blessed Lady, the Immaculate Conception.



All stand at the sound of the Sacristy bell.



Philippians 3:8-14

I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won, All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.
